This workshop will provide useful knowledge and teach practical skills for dairy owners, managers, and employees to improve the **HOOF HEALTH** of their cattle. Participants will receive hands-on instruction and practice in the art of foot trimming and treating lame cows, as well as how to practically analyze different aspects of a farm's nutritional program.
